Q: How essential has DB Primary been in teaching your pupils remotely?



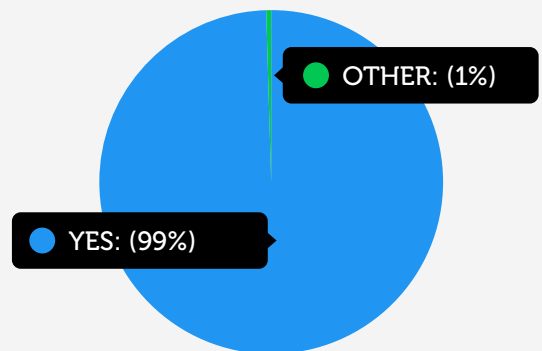
4.90 Average Rating

Q: Has DB Primary been essential to pupils communicating and maintaining school community?

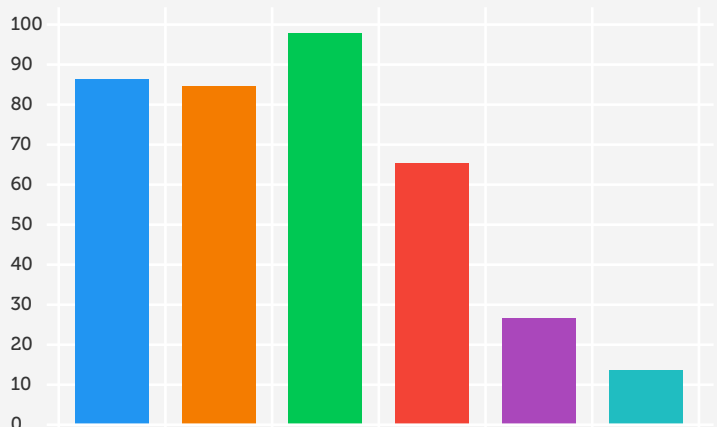
99% of schools said yes
